



Pinaymootang First Nation is located on Highway 6, approximately a 2h 30min drive (230 km) north of Winnipeg.

Service Centres

Moosehorn and Ashern are both approximately a 30min drive south of Pinaymootang First Nation. Gypsumville is a 15min drive north.



Classes offered

Pinaymootang School offers a land-based education program and an excellent Ojibway language class. It is important that students understand their culture and have the knowledge needed to pass down community wisdom to future generations.

Events

Hosting events is something Pinaymootang First Nation likes to do often. Some of the most notable events that take place are the winter carnival, spirit week, and book fairs. Events are a great way to get residents of the community to come together and have fun.

Competitions

Pinaymootang School is quite active in the sports community. Numerous sports teams are frequently sent out to compete with other schools. The sports teams at Pinaymootang School include track and field, volleyball, basketball, and floor hockey.



Student facilities

Students have access to a gymnasium, computer lab, science lab, library, multi-purpose room, automotive mechanic shop, and home economics room.

Teacher facilities


Teachers have access to a staff lounge and all student facilities.

Wi-Fi/cellular service

Pinaymootang has excellent Wi-Fi and cellular service within the school and community.











What is Pinaymootang School looking for in a teacher?

Pinaymootang School is looking for energetic and enthusiastic teachers who are full of wisdom and knowledge. Teachers' first priority should be the children, always having empathy towards their students. A good understanding of the school curriculum is preferred for teachers seeking to join Pinaymootang School.

Average day

Teachers start at 8:30 a.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. Throughout the day, teachers take care of the students and provide them with quality education. Teachers act as role models and demonstrate leadership skills.

Other responsibilities

When teachers are not educating the students, they are responsible for recess and lunch duty. Teachers also supervise extracurricular activities and field trips.



Teacherages

Pinaymootang School has teacherages available for teachers. Hydro, water, washer/dryer, and kitchen appliances are all included.

Rent

Rent is subsidized. Reasonable rates are available.

Distance from the school

The teacherages are located behind the school.

Pet friendly

Pets may be accommodated upon request.

Wi-Fi/cellular service

Wi-Fi and cellular service is excellent in the teacherages and community.







Highlights

Fishing and hunting are main sources of leisure. The most popular fishing spot is near the Fairford Dam.

Steep Rock Provincial Park is a 30 min drive southeast of Pinaymootang on Lake Manitoba.

Community life

Residents of the community frequently visit nearby communities. Within the community, the arena is used for a variety of entertainment events.

Services

Pinaymootang First Nation has all of the essential services including a gas bar, general store, local motel, restaurants and a church. Additional services can be found in nearby communities.
