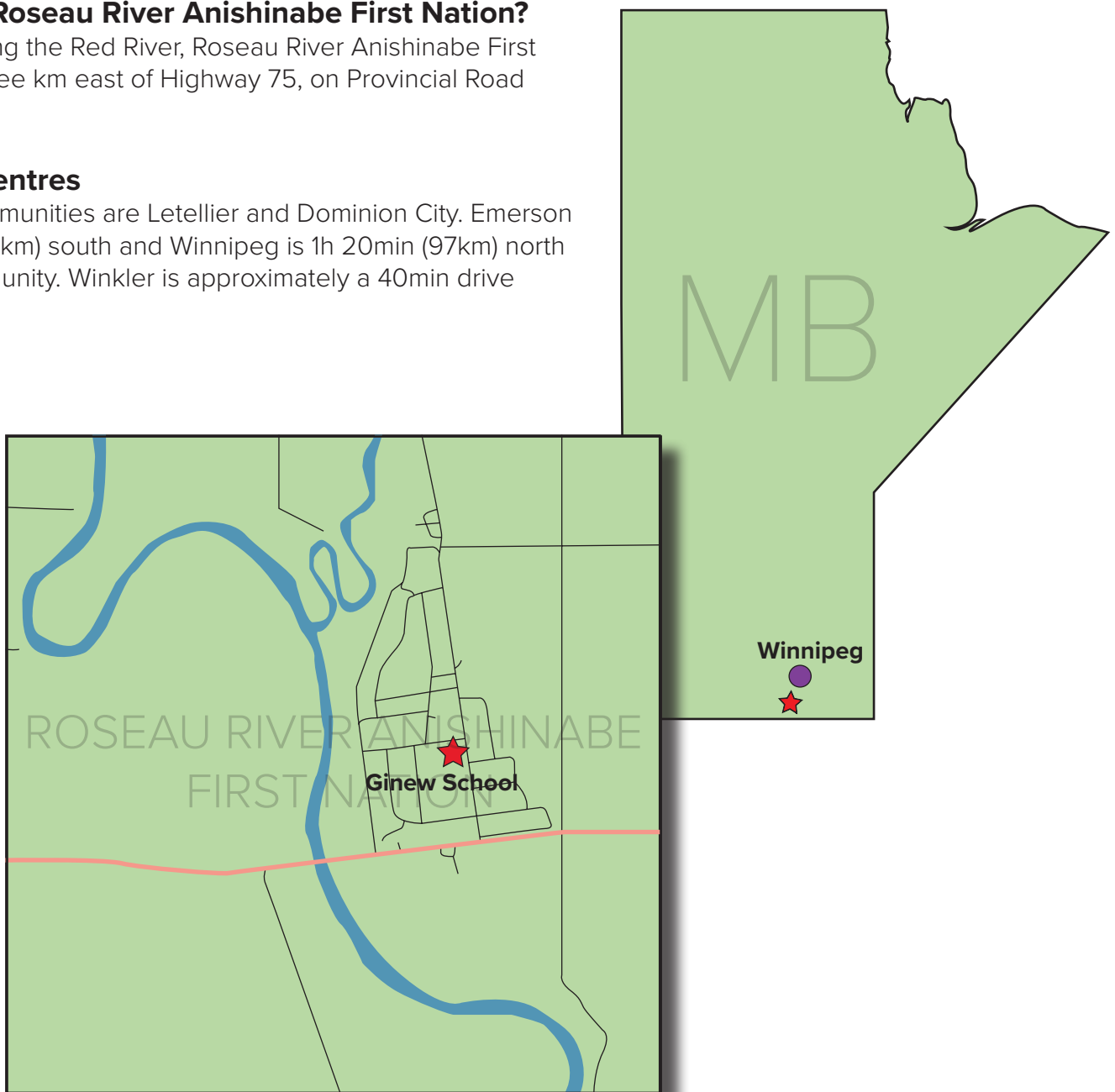
Surrounding Land

Where is Roseau River Anishinabe First Nation?

Nestled along the Red River, Roseau River Anishinabe First Nation is three km east of Highway 75, on Provincial Road 201.

Service Centres

Nearby communities are Letellier and Dominion City. Emerson is 20min (26km) south and Winnipeg is 1h 20min (97km) north of the community. Winkler is approximately a 40min drive (60km).

Roseau River Anishinabe First Nation is a welcoming and supportive community that regularly hosts events for its residents. Some of these events include school barbecues, a monthly breakfast, and cultural days. The Gathering of Friends Celebration is held every year which includes sharing stories, songs, ceremonies and traditions with the neighbouring communities. The celebration also features a powwow demonstration and is one of the highlights of each year.

Average day

Teachers start at 8:30 a.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. Throughout the day, teachers take care of students by nurturing them with a positive education experience. Teachers act as role models by demonstrating strong leadership skills.
